Brandon-

As I mentioned in my email last week our engineers did find two compromised locations in the ducting from our dryer to our cyclone outside. We believe this may have been contributing to some of the odor complaints that have been received.

Can you let us know if you have received any complaints between 5/28 and 6/7? If so, can you give us the date and time of the complaint?

As for additional odor reduction options we have spent the last six plus weeks working with multiple vendors on multiple odor reduction options. As we discussed on April 30th at our facility there are a lot of different opinions and different ways to potentially address this issue. We have explored carbon absorption filtration, strobic fans, and two different types of air scrubbing systems.

After working with our engineering firm, DeKalb Mechanical and Nicholas and Associates we whittled down our proposals to the attached two options. I have also included a letter from Nicholas and Associates for your review. There are more cost effective options out there, but these two air scrubbing systems will most likely appease the Village as well as the residents and as we have discussed on multiple conversations we are looking for a long term, clear and effective solution.

As you can imagine all of this information the Village is asking for is completely custom as anything we do will have to be retrofitted to our current machinery. It is not as easy as just buying a solution off the shelf. We are working diligently to get this resolved and will continue to do so as quickly as possible.

Re: Ventilation Solutions

Dear Joe,

As a follow up to our meeting onsite with the Village of Mount Prospect, Nicholas has retained the services of multiple companies to provide proposed solutions to accommodate the building exhaust and mute any potential odors from such exhaust.

Two of the solutions include 4 stage process which collects the exhaust air on the dryer side of the manufacturing process and running it thru activated carbon filters prior to releasing into the atmosphere. These systems include all ductwork, fans, fittings, filters, etc. to provide a complete solution. (See sketch attached)

1. Scrub-Air systems, Inc. – Total Price = \$132,130
2. DeKalb Mechanical – Total Price = \$109,900

In looking for most cost-effective solutions, options include placing a round “hat” of assembled activated carbon filter over the top of the dryer cyclone. In discussions with Bact Process Systems, Inc., this solution has been used similarly at locations in the Chicagoland area. These solutions are still being designed & priced and we hope to have proposal(s) today and/or tomorrow.

Once all pricing has been obtained, we can sit, review and decide on a direction to proceed.

We understand time is of the essence. The team hopes to make some decisions by the end of this week at the latest. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Nick or myself.
