



New PaintCare Program Makes Paint Recycling Easier for Illinois Residents

Do you have leftover paint collecting dust in your basement, garage, or shed? Illinois residents now have an easy, convenient, and environmentally responsible way to recycle unwanted paint through the PaintCare program.

PaintCare is a nonprofit organization created by paint manufacturers to operate paint stewardship programs in states that have enacted paint stewardship laws. The Illinois PaintCare program launched in December 2025 and provides hundreds of year-round drop-off locations throughout the state where residents can recycle leftover paint at no additional cost. The program is funded through a small PaintCare fee that is included in the purchase price of new architectural paint. The fee covers the cost of collecting, transporting, recycling, and properly managing leftover paint.

What Paint Products Are Accepted? | PaintCare collection sites accept most architectural coatings, including:

- Interior and exterior latex and oil-based paint
- Primers
- Stains
- Sealers
- Shellac
- Varnishes
- Deck and floor coatings

Paint should be in its original container with the manufacturer's label intact.

What Is Not Accepted? | The following products are not accepted through PaintCare:

- Aerosol spray paint
- Automotive paint
- Paint thinners and solvents
- Industrial or marine coatings
- Epoxy products
- Adhesives and glues

These materials should be taken to a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection event or another approved disposal facility.



Reduce Waste First

Before disposing of paint, consider these simple tips:

- Buy only the amount of paint you need.
- Save leftover paint for future touch-ups.
- Share usable paint with neighbors, friends, or community organizations.
- Donate unopened paint to local nonprofits or community projects.

Find a Drop-Off Location | To find the nearest PaintCare drop-off site, learn which products are accepted, or get additional information about the program, visit the official PaintCare website: paintcare.org.

Paint Disposal Options | Residents have several convenient options for managing leftover paint:

- **PAINTCARE DROP-OFF SITES** | PaintCare operates hundreds of year-round collection sites throughout Illinois where accepted paint products can be recycled free of charge.
- **HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION EVENTS** | Products not accepted through PaintCare can often be disposed of at Household Hazardous Waste collection events.
- **DRY OUT LATEX PAINT** | Small amounts of latex paint may be dried by removing the lid and adding kitty litter, shredded newspaper, or a commercial paint hardener. Once completely dry, dispose of the hardened paint according to your community's waste collection guidelines.

Properly recycling leftover paint helps conserve natural resources, reduces landfill waste, and protects our environment. Thank you for doing your part to keep our community clean and sustainable.

• Plastic bags are not accepted in your recycling cart. They will contaminate the recycling process.

• If you place the wrong items in your recycling cart it may not be collected.

Recycling Facts

How much does the Single Family Refuse and Recycling program cost per household? \$301.48/annually (2026 rate).

Where does our recycling go? Recycling is taken to Groot's Recycling material processing facility in Elk Grove Village.

Where does our garbage go? Waste generated from Mount Prospect residential properties is currently being processed at the Winnebago Landfill Company (in Winnebago County, Illinois), which is privately owned by Rock River Environmental Services.

With Recycle Coach, residents can:

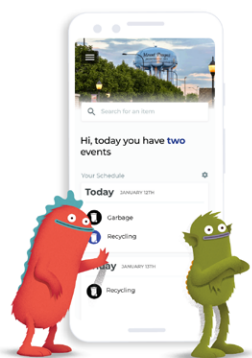

What can you do to help prevent recycling contamination?

- Check what you can put in your cart.
- Only include acceptable items in your recycling cart.
- Clean, empty, and dry all your recyclable containers.
- Keep your recyclables loose. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**

Plastic Bag and Film Packaging Recycling

The Village of Mount Prospect partners with Trex Company to offer residents two locations for plastic bag collection drop-off. When residents bring their unwanted plastic materials to Trex drop-off locations, not only are they helping to keep thousands of pounds of waste out of landfills, they are also helping Trex create beautiful and environmentally responsible outdoor products like benches and decking.

This recycling option is especially important since these materials **ARE NOT ACCEPTED** in the Village's curbside recycling program. The materials contaminate other recycling, which means **if you place these items in your recycling bin, it will cause the entire contents to go to the landfill and not be recycled.**

Material brought to the drop-off locations must be **clean and dry.**

The Village also encourages residents to continue dropping-off plastic bags and film packaging at participating Trex recycling partner locations including: Jewel Osco, Mariano's Fresh Market, Meijer, and Target.



The following materials will be accepted at both drop-off locations:

- Newspaper sleeves
- Bread bags
- Product wrap
- Cereal liners
- Food storage bags
- Ice bags
- Produce bags
- Dry cleaning bags
- Plastic grocery bags
- Case overwrap
- Air pillows used in packaging
- Salt bags

Textile Recycling | CURBSIDE COLLECTION OF CLOTHING

Mount Prospect, in partnership with Simple Recycling, offers a convenient collection program that will help reduce the harmful environmental impact of textile waste. The free textile collection service aims to forge long-lasting benefits for the environment, people, and communities alike.

Pick-ups must be scheduled online at simplerecycling.com or by calling 866.835.5068. Textiles can be in any clean paper or plastic bag or box. Place bags or boxes by your front door on your pickup day.

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), 85% of all clothing ends up in the landfill with only 15% being donated. Proactive efforts to recycle clothing, shoes, and accessories today can have the same impact as removing millions of cars from the nation's roads. In addition, when recycled or reused, these items help

reduce greenhouse gases more than recycling glass, plastics, and yard trimmings.

For residents who traditionally donate clothing to charities, the Village and Simple Recycling encourage them to continue to do so.

Electronics Recycling Drop-off

In September 2009, Illinois became the 16th state to adopt an electronics recycling law known as the Electronics Products Recycling and Reuse Act (SB2313). This legislation bans certain electronic items, mainly computers and televisions, from Illinois landfills.

To assist residents with collecting old electronics and to ensure environmentally safe recycling of these materials, the Village, in partnership with SWANCC and Com2 Recycling Solutions, has established an Electronics Recycling Drop-off site at the Mount Prospect Public Works Facility.

Not all electronic items will be accepted. Please review the *Electronics Recycling Acceptable Items* list to see if your electronics item will be accepted. If you do not find your electronic listed as an acceptable item please consult the SWANCC Reuse/Recycle Directory (*swancc.org*) for alternative recycling options.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Battery Recycling



The Village (with the sponsorship of SWANCC) offers a battery recycling program. The purpose of the program is to provide a convenient method for recycling of household alkaline and rechargeable batteries and prevent disposal in landfills.

Who is allowed to participate? The program is open to all Mount Prospect residents and SWANCC community residents.

What type of batteries will be accepted? The program is only designed to accept household alkaline batteries (*AAA, AA, C, D, 9V and button cells*), rechargeable batteries (*NiCad, NiMh, lithium ion, and lithium polymer*), and computer batteries. We will not accept Nickel Iron, Mercury, Silver Oxide, or Lead Acid batteries. These battery types would include car, marine, and sump pump.

What type of preparation is needed? For all rechargeable batteries (Lithium, NiMh, and NiCad), residents must cover the contact points of each rechargeable battery with masking tape or place each rechargeable battery in an individual self-locking plastic bag so that the contact points on batteries do not touch each other during collection or transportation, which can cause a fire hazard. Batteries that are not prepared properly will not be accepted. This is not necessary with household or alkaline batteries.

Where do I drop off my batteries? Batteries can be brought to the Public Works Department, 1700 W. Central Rd., at the west end of the parking lot (*available 24/7*).

Compact Fluorescent Recycling

Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs (CFLs) contain mercury vapor, which makes disposing of the bulbs a concern.

In response, the Village, in cooperation with SWANCC, offers a free recycling program to Mount Prospect and SWANCC residents. Residents can bring their CFLs and up to four foot fluorescent (*maximum of 12 total*) to the Public Works Department, 1700 W. Central Rd., at the west end of the parking lot (*available 24/7*) for recycling. CFLs/tubes should be unbroken, and CFLs should be in a zip lock bag for proper recycling.

This program is for residentially generated CFLs/tubes. Incandescent bulbs are not hazardous and can be disposed of with your regular solid waste.

Styrofoam Recycling

Public Works accepts Styrofoam materials for recycling (*residential waste only*) at the Public Works Facility, located at 1700 W. Central Rd. This allows us all to contribute to a cleaner environment while reducing waste in our landfills.

Drop-Off Hours

Tuesdays | 10 am – 12 pm
Thursdays | 1 – 3 pm

Drop-off is available only during these designated hours.

Accepted Items

- Foam packaging from TVs, appliances, computers, and furniture
- Foam coolers
- Foam food-service items, including egg cartons, trays, takeout containers, cups, and plates

All Styrofoam must be clean and dry, with all tape and labels removed.

Not Accepted

- Blue or pink foam insulation
- Construction foam insulation
- Squishy or flexible foam, such as pool noodles
- Liquid-absorbing pads from fish or meat trays



- Foam with excessive food residue, dirt, or paint
- Foam packing sheets, peanuts, pieces, or noodles
- Furniture cushions
- Plastic cutlery or strapping
- Shrink wrap
- Cardboard

How Styrofoam Is Recycled

Collected Styrofoam is processed using a foam densifier. The material is crushed and shredded, heated and compressed, then extruded into dense blocks called ingots.

Densification reduces Styrofoam to as little as 1/90th of its original volume, making it easier to transport and recycle into new products. The process is quick, safe, and environmentally friendly, with no harmful emissions released into the air.

By recycling Styrofoam, residents can help reduce landfill waste and protect our environment.

Medication/Sharps Recycling



The Medication/Sharps Recycling Program is for residents of SWANCC's member communities.

- Medication drop-off is available 24/7 next to the Recycling Center at the west end of the Public Works parking lot.

- Sharps can be dropped off Monday-Friday, 7:30 am – 4:00 pm. Please do not leave sharps during non-business hours.

No prescription drugs or sharps from businesses, schools or hospitals will be accepted.

General Tips

- Prescription drugs that are more than a year old should be disposed of properly.
- Turn in non-prescription medicines without an expiration date that are more than six months old.

- Keep pharmaceuticals in their original containers with labels to identify contents.
- Blackout or cross off patient's name on pharmaceutical labels.
- Sharps need to be placed in a rigid container with a sealed lid. A new sharps container will be provided.

Acceptable Items

- Unused/expired prescription medications including narcotics
- Prescription cough syrup
- Prescription ear drops and eye drops
- Expired over the counter medications
- Residential sharps

Unacceptable Items

- Institutional or business waste
- Non-prescription liquids



Holiday Lights Recycling Program

Did you purchase new holiday lights and don't know what to do with the old ones? Do you have a set of lights or extension cords that you can't get to work? Don't throw them in the garbage. You can recycle them free of charge.

The Village accepts unused and non-working holiday string lights and extension cords year round. The materials in the string lights and extension cords will be reclaimed



and reprocessed into new products. Most importantly they will be kept out of the landfill.

Residents can drop off their unwanted holiday string lights and extension cords at the Public Works Department, 1700 W. Central Rd., at the west end of the parking lot (*available 24/7*).

Unlimited Organics Collection Program

The Village yard waste program, known as the Organics Program, accepts organic material—including fruits, vegetables, and meat—in addition to yard waste. All yard waste and organics material will be collected in unlimited quantities for no additional charge, but residents must provide their own rigid container or obtain one through the cart rental program for collection. Organics Service will be provided from April through mid-December.



ACCEPTABLE ORGANICS

- Grass clippings
- Brush
- Flowers
- Leaves
- Fruits & vegetables
- Pastas
- Meat (no bone)
- Breads
- Crackers
- Cereals
- Cheese, yogurt (no liquids)
- Coffee grounds

NON-ACCEPTABLE ORGANICS

- Plastic bags (*including compostable bags*)
- Styrofoam
- Bones, seafood
- Shrink wrap
- Chip and candy wrappers
- Plastic forks, knives, or spoons
- Plastic containers or wrap from food packaging
- Plastic of any kind
- Glass of any kind
- No beverages

Organics/Yard Waste Collection Details

CONTAINER SPECIFICATIONS

Any size container up to 95 gallons is acceptable with this program. Residents are responsible for maintaining personally owned yard waste containers.

- Rigid containers up to 32 gallons cannot exceed more than 50 lbs as they are manually tipped by the driver.
- Rigid containers 32 gallons and larger must be wheeled carts as they are picked up with a hydraulic arm.

BAG SPECIFICATIONS

If you choose to use kraft paper bags, you will only be able to dispose of yard waste material. Material identified as organic food items must be disposed of in a rigid container.

- Bags must be made of biodegradable kraft paper. Biodegradable bags made out of corn starch or similar products are not acceptable.
- Bags cannot exceed 32 gallon capacity. The bag will not be collected if it exceeds 32 gallons.

- Bags cannot exceed 50 lbs. The bag will not be collected if it exceeds 50 lbs.
- Plastic bags cannot be used to dispose of yard waste. Plastic bags containing yard waste will not be collected.

Organics/yard waste generated from Mount Prospect residential properties will be taken to Thelen Materials in Antioch.

COLLECTION

SET-OUT TIMES

Yard waste can be placed at the curb as early as 4:30 pm the day before collection and no later than 6:30 am on collection day. Late set-outs will not be collected until the following week.



Brush Collection

BRUSH LESS THAN 3.5 INCHES IN DIAMETER

- Residents may set out an unlimited number of properly prepared bundles of brush.
- Brush bundles are collected on your regular collection day.
- Tree limbs must not exceed 3.5 inches diameter.
- Brush must be bundled – bundles not to exceed 50 pounds, 5 feet in length and must be secured with a biodegradable material (cloth or twine); no wire or plastic.



BRUSH GREATER THAN 3.5 INCHES IN DIAMETER

- Brush or logs greater than 3.5 inches in diameter are taken as garbage and not collected as yard waste.
- Logs can be placed in your garbage cart for collection or placed outside the cart. If logs are placed outside the cart, the logs must be prepared according to the following specifications:
 - Bundles or individual logs will be collected on your regular scheduled collection day, not to exceed 50 pounds and 5 feet in length.
 - 1 cubic yard limit (approximately 6 bundles or large logs equal 1 cubic yard).
 - Bundles must be secured with cloth or twine; no wire or plastic.

CURBSIDE ORGANICS COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Not everything belongs in your organics bin.

Use this guide to see what can (and can't) be included in organics recycling.

Put as many of these items in your organics bin as you like!

Organics/Yard Waste Cart Rental

Households producing a large amount of organics/yard waste may be interested in the Village's optional yard waste cart rental program. The program has a monthly fee of \$4.27 (2026 rate) for cart rental paid directly to the Village through resident refuse bill. This cost includes the use of a wheeled cart (cart size of your choice – 35, 65 or 95 gallon).



Service is provided once a week on your scheduled collection day between April and mid-December.

Solid Waste Management Contract

The Village of Mount Prospect has a comprehensive Solid Waste Management program that promotes waste reduction and resource recovery. The Village's residential solid waste services are paid through an annual direct charge on your water bill or quarterly if you do not receive Village provided water service.

The Village's exclusive residential solid waste contract provides services to single-family residences (*curbside collection*), multi-family (*centralized refuse containers*), and commercial properties. The Public Works Department administers the solid waste contract and serves as the liaison between the resident and the refuse hauler.

Standard Refuse and Recycling

As part of the solid waste collection program, all residential properties receiving curbside collection are issued two wheeled carts, one for refuse and the second cart for recycling.

Refuse Container

One 35, 65, or 95 gallon wheeled cart for refuse service. The green cart or blue with black lid is for trash only. All trash must be placed in the cart. Any trash outside of the cart that is not on the approved bulk item list (*see page 10*) will not be collected. Your options are to hold onto the trash until the next scheduled collection day (*charges do apply*).

Recycling Container

One 35, 65, or 95 gallon wheeled cart for recycling service. The blue cart is for commingled recyclables such as: newspaper, mixed paper, corrugated cardboard; glass food and beverage containers; steel, tin, and bimetal containers; empty aerosol and aluminum cans; aluminum foil, formed-foil; and wax polycoated *gable topped* beverage containers such as milk cartons, juice drink boxes, whipping cream cartons, and fabric softener refills (*see page 2 for details*). **Do not put recyclables into plastic garbage bags.**

Refuse & Recycling Carts

The durable, plastic wheeled carts that are used for the solid waste program are designed specifically for residential properties and feature a permanently attached lid and a handle that allows for easy maneuvering.

- 35 GALLON WHEELED CART (38"Hx23"Wx21"D) | Holds three standard kitchen bags
- 65 GALLON WHEELED CART (41.5"Hx25"Wx25"D) | Holds six standard kitchen bags
- 95 GALLON WHEELED CART (47"Hx30"Wx30"D) | Holds twelve standard kitchen bags

The Village understands that a household's solid waste needs may change over time creating a need for greater or reduced solid waste capacity. To address this issue, households are allowed to exchange their current refuse and/or recycling cart for a different size cart at no cost to the resident.

The Village also offers additional carts for households needing

additional refuse and recycling capacity. Additional refuse carts can be purchased for a one time non-refundable rental fee of \$25 for each additional refuse cart regardless of size. Households are allowed one free recycling cart in addition to the recycling cart originally provided by the Village. Cart exchanges can be made by calling the Public Works Department at 847.870.5640. Once an exchange request has been made, the cart(s) will be exchanged by Republic Services on the resident's first scheduled collection day after the request. A representative from Republic Services will make the exchange after refuse trucks have finished collection. A resident that has scheduled an exchange must leave their cart(s) at the curb after collection. The new cart(s) will not be delivered if the old cart(s) are not at the curb. **Please DO NOT bring carts to Public Works for exchange.**

If you have a damaged cart, the Village will repair or replace the cart(s) at no cost to you. Contact the Public Works Department at 847.870.5640 to report the damaged cart. A representative from Republic Services will be dispatched to repair or replace the cart on the next scheduled garbage collection day. Refuse and/or recycling carts will not be exchanged for aesthetic or odor issues. Residents are responsible for cleaning their own containers.

Refuse & Recycling Cart Placement

Refuse and recycling wheeled carts must be placed at the curb on your scheduled collection day to be collected.

Wheeled Cart Placement Dos

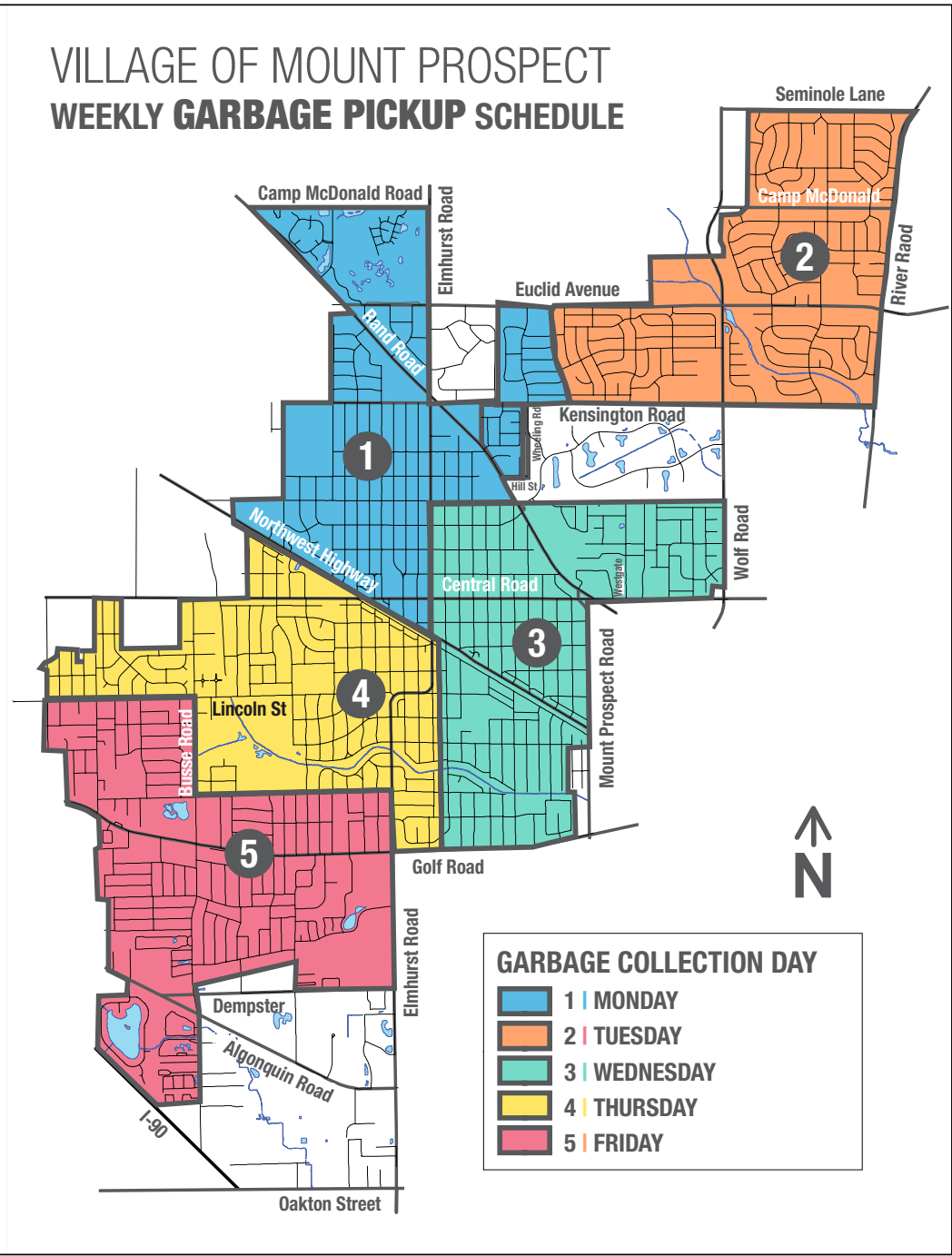
- Carts should be placed on the driveway apron at the curb line or on the parkway.
- Carts should be placed for collection with the handle facing away from the street.
- Carts should be placed at the curb with a 2 foot separation between the carts, mailbox, or sign posts.
- Cart lids must be closed.

Wheeled Cart Placement Don'ts

- Carts should not be placed in the street.
- Cart lids should not be open.
- Items should not be placed on top of the closed lid.
- Do not place items (white goods, bulk items, yard waste) in front of the carts.

Cart Storage

- Village Code regulates where refuse, recycling, and yard waste containers may be stored on your property.
- Carts or yard waste containers can be stored along the side, rear, or in the garage of a property.
- Cart or containers cannot be stored in front of the property. Carts stored on the driveway in front of an attached garage or in the front yard are in violation of Village Code.
- Corner houses may not place receptacles in a corner or exterior side yard unless receptacles are completely screened from adjacent streets by permanent fence or dense planting.



MPDelivers/SeeClickFix

Need to replace or exchange your refuse or recycling cart? Contact Public Works at 847.870.5640 or submit an online service request on our Customer Response Module, referred to as MPDelivers or SeeClickFix, which is the first action button on the homepage at mountprospect.org. It provides access to Village services from initial request to completion. MPDelivers/SeeClickFix is available free for download on your smartphone and can be used to submit issues like refuse/recycling cart replacement or exchange or other Public Works requests.



Collection Set-Out Times

Refuse and recycling can be placed at the curb as early as 4:30 pm the day before collection but no later than 6:30 am of the collection day. Late set-outs will not be collected until the following week. Empty carts are to be removed the same day as collection.

Missed Collection

If the refuse hauler misses your collection, it will be picked up the next working day. Please call Public Works at 847.870.5640 within 24 hours to report the missed pick-up.

Improperly prepared refuse, recyclables, yard material, etc. will not be collected. Materials that are not collected due to non-compliance must be removed from the parkway and stored on the resident's property. Material must be prepared properly and set at the curb the next week for collection.

Holiday Collection Schedule

There will be NO collection on the following holidays:

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Memorial Day	Thanksgiving Day
4th of July	Christmas Day

If a holiday falls on a weekday or is observed on a weekday and your regularly scheduled pickup is on that day or after, your pickup will be delayed by one day. Friday pickups will be done on Saturday. The following week will return to the regular collection schedule.

If New Year's, Independence, or Christmas Day fall on a Sunday, the holiday will be observed on Monday. Garbage collection will be delayed one day with Monday's collection occurring on Tuesday, etc. The following week will return to the regular collection schedule.



Bulk Items

Bulk items are collected weekly on your regular scheduled collection day. Collection is provided at no additional charge and there is no limit on the number of items that can be placed at the curb. The following is a list of approved bulk items:

- Lawn Care Equipment (*no gasoline*)
 - Countertop Microwave Ovens
 - Mattresses/Box Springs
 - Carpet Rolls (*no longer than 5', bundled & tied*)
 - Snowblowers/Shovels
 - Plumbing Fixtures
 - Glass Doors & Mirrors (*tape across the glass with duct tape*)
- Furniture
 - Bicycles
 - Swing Sets (*5 foot lengths*)
 - Barbecue Grills (*no propane tanks unless empty*)
 - Toilets (*tank & bowl separated*)

This is not an exhaustive list of bulk items. If you do not see your item on the list, please contact the Public Works Department to see if it will be collected as a bulk item.

White Goods (Appliances)

Appliances will be collected for an additional fee that must be paid the day of pick up. Arrangements for white good collection must be made directly with Republic Services at 847.981.0091.



Clearing Out the Clutter?

Residents may bring refuse and debris to the Glenview Transfer Station. You will be required to unload your own vehicle. There is a minimum charge of \$25 for 500 lbs or less (*2026 rate*); \$100 per ton. White goods such as refrigerators, washers, and dryers may be disposed of on a fee per item basis. Only major credit cards are acceptable for payment. For more information, call the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) at 847.724.9205 or email info@swancc.org.

NOTE: Household hazardous waste (paint, cleaning products, motor oil or automotive batteries), any type of landscape waste, concrete, asbestos roofing shingles and materials or medical/liquid wastes are NOT accepted at the drop-off.

Special Collections

Excess trash, non-bulk items, construction debris in excess of one cubic yard, large tree limbs and stumps will be collected for an additional fee. Arrangements must be made directly with Republic Services at 847.981.0091. Material must be properly prepared.

Construction Debris

Construction debris must be placed in the wheeled cart. Debris placed in the cart must be prepared in a manner that allows the lid of the cart to close (*ex: boards placed in the cart must be cut to a size allowing the lid to close*).



Materials that cannot be containerized must be prepared in the following manner: Bundles are not to exceed 5 feet in length nor 50 pounds in weight; 1 cubic yard limit. (Approximately 6 bundles equal 1 cubic yard). Doors count as one bundle of construction debris. Doors do not need to be cut to size.

Move-in Debris

Residents moving into a home in the Village are entitled to a 1 time only unlimited move-in collection at no charge. Residents must call Public Works at 847.870.5640 within 1 month of the move in to arrange for collection. All restrictions and guidelines regarding the preparation of materials and limitations on construction debris apply to move-in collections.



Christmas Trees



Christmas trees will be collected for composting by the refuse hauler at no additional cost on your regular refuse collection day for the first two weeks of January (*see website for exact dates*). After two weeks, trees will be collected as garbage.

Christmas trees set out for composting must be free of all decorative debris. Please remove all decorative items from the tree including:

- Lights • Ornaments • Strings • Tinsel • Wires

Please do not cut or trim trees for collection; place trees at the curb whole.

Natural wreaths are considered refuse due to the metal frame and will be collected as refuse. Artificial wreaths are not recyclable.

One-Day Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events

The Village hosts up to two one-day, by appointment only, household hazardous waste collection events throughout the year. Please check the Village website, mountprospect.org, for information and availability.

Mount Prospect residents only.

Materials collected will be disposed of in the most environmentally friendly method possible. Some of the eligible items include aerosol paints and solvents, pool chemicals, insecticides, used motor oil, and cleaning products.

Mercury Thermometer Disposal

NEVER use a vacuum to clean up mercury. If you have a mercury spill, contact the Illinois Department of Public Health at 217.782.5830, or go to idph.state.il.us/mercury for cleanup procedures.

Recycle your eyeglasses and hearing aids!

You may recycle your eyeglasses and hearing aids at the Public Works Facility, Monday-Friday from 7:30 am – 4 pm. The donated eyeglasses will be taken to the Lions of Illinois Foundation in DeKalb. Metal frames will be melted down and sold for scrap to help defray shipping costs. Plastic frames and all lenses are shipped to Indiana for refurbishing. Upon completion, the glasses will be shipped to eye doctors outside of the U.S., where people in need will get these glasses for free. Unfortunately there is no recycling program for eyeglass cases at this time, and those that are donated to the Lions get disposed of.

Hearing aids, also collected by the Lions, are also sent to Lions of Illinois Foundation in DeKalb. From there, they get refurbished by a hearing aid company, and are then made available through the Foundation to anyone in need of hearing aids.
