

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

The Department of Public Works consists of six operational divisions, including Administrative, Engineering, Forestry, Streets & Building, Vehicle Maintenance, and Water & Sewer. There are 66 full-time, 7 part-time, and 31 seasonal employees. The full-time, part-time and seasonal personnel assigned to maintenance functions are interchanged between the Streets, Forestry and Water & Sewer Divisions as dictated by need.

Streetlight LED Conversion Program

The Streetlight Light Emitting Diode (LED) Conversion Program is a scheduled maintenance activity designed to convert all Village-owned, non-operational and energy inefficient, mercury vapor fixtures to LEDs. Based on the Streetlight Inspection Program, there are over 200 mercury vapor streetlight fixtures that require conversion. These identified conversions include mercury vapor (and possibly other 15 years or older high intensity discharge) street lighting that exist in the system. The conversion to LEDs is anticipated to reduce future labor and electricity costs. It is projected that there will be approximately 50 streetlight fixtures converted per year by in-house maintenance personnel over a 4 year period, which may vary depending on whether the pole, fixture, or base will need to be replaced.
