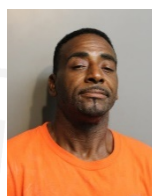

Mount Prospect Police Charge Two Male Subjects with Burglary

On Tuesday, July 16, 2019, the Mount Prospect Police Department arrested Fred D. Harris, 57 years old, of 12119 S. Justine Street, Chicago, Illinois and Renard Huston, 52 years old, of 140 N. Mason Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. Harris and Huston were both charged with one felony count of Burglary and one misdemeanor count of Criminal Trespass to Real Property, stemming from an investigation of suspicious persons entering a construction site at 20 W. Northwest Highway.

On July 16, 2019 at approximately 8:14 PM, the Mount Prospect Police Department responded to the building under construction at 20 W. Northwest Highway for a 911 call of two subjects who entered into the construction site. Numerous officers responded to the large site and established a perimeter around the building. The police K9 Unit from Mount Prospect, along with two police K9 Units from the Arlington Heights Police Department responded to the scene to conduct a thorough search of the entire building. Mount Prospect Police K9 Alex located Renard Huston hiding from police inside the building, while Arlington Heights Police K9 Vargo located Fred D. Harris hiding inside as well. Harris and Huston were taken into custody and transported to the Mount Prospect Police Station. There they were each charged with one felony count of Burglary and one misdemeanor count of Criminal Trespass to Real Property.

Harris and Huston were transported to a Cook County 3rd District Courthouse in Rolling Meadows for a bond hearing on July 17, 2019, where their bond was each set at \$30,000.00 "D". The next court date for both Harris and Huston is set for August 9, 2019, at the Cook County 3rd District Courthouse in Rolling Meadows in room 108 at 10:30 PM.

The public is reminded that criminal charges are not evidence of guilt and that all defendants in a criminal case are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law.
