Mount Prospect's Community Engagement Committee will be hosting a virtual "Community Conversation" on Tuesday, July 28, 2020 from 6-7:30 pm via a video webinar.

The conversation will be focused around the national discussion concerning racial justice issues, equality, diversity and inclusion. Panelists will include Mayor Arlene Juracek, Community Engagement Committee members, community members, representatives of the Mount Prospect Police Department, the Board of Fire and Police Commission, Human Services Department, and faith leaders.

"I am personally committed to addressing racial bias and social inequity in our community and welcome the efforts of village leadership and the Community Engagement Committee for this opportunity for honest and open exchange," said Mayor Juracek. "This conversation is but one step to convey what we are doing, and to hear about resident concerns and suggestions."

The meeting agenda includes remarks by Mayor Juracek, presentations by community members, the Mount Prospect Police Department/BOFPC with a focus on current policies, training and community engagement. A question and answer period will follow the formal presentations. Registered participants will be able to submit live questions via chat during the webinar.
