

News from the Finance Department

Vehicle Sticker Reminder

April 30 was the deadline for displaying your 2021-22 vehicle sticker. If you still need to purchase a sticker you can do so online (option not available for first-time seniors or handicapped), by mail (Village of Mount Prospect, Attn: Vehicle Stickers, 50 East Emerson Street, 60056), 24-hour payment boxes at Village Hall, in person at Village Hall (Finance Department), or the Elmhurst Road Currency Exchange, 1698 South Elmhurst Road (standard-price stickers only; an additional \$2 service fee per sticker).

If you are an established resident and purchase a new vehicle after April 30, or you are a new resident after April 30, you have 30 days to purchase a vehicle sticker. Proof of vehicle purchase or move-in date is required.

If you change vehicles after having purchased a 2021-2022 sticker, please contact the Finance Department with updated vehicle information, as you may be eligible to transfer the sticker for no additional fee.

Utility Bill Payment Options

The Village offers several easy-to-use payment options for water, sewer and refuse bills:

• One-time online payment with a credit or debit card, through the Village website, mountprospect.org

(no service fee). Online payment is secure and available 24 hours/day.

- Direct debit with a credit or debit card, or bank account, through the Village website, mountprospect.org (no service fee). Funds are withdrawn on the due date.
- 24-hour payment kiosk located outside Village Hall. You may access your account by entering your account number or simply scanning the QR code that appears on your bill. The kiosk accepts credit and debit cards, checks, and cash. Blank checks are accepted; the kiosk scans only the bank account information on a check, and processes the payment for the amount entered by the user. Partial or entire balance payments are accepted. A printed, texted, or emailed receipt is offered.
- 24-hour payment boxes located outside the front door of Village Hall and in the parking garage, next to the library book return.
- By mail or in person at the Finance Department of Village Hall.

Government Finance Officers Association Award

The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) has awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to the Village of Mount Prospect for its comprehensive annual financial report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2019. The report has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program, which includes demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the report.

The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

How are the Village's Water and Sewer rates determined?

The Village Board approved and adopted a water/sewer rate study in 2017 to define the rate increases needed for water/sewer funds to keep pace with the infrastructure needs of the water/sewer utilities. Before the adoption of the study, the Village infrastructure for the water/sewer utilities were at the replacement cycle of 600+ years, far beyond this infrastructure's normal lifespan of 75 years. With the help of the rate structure provided in the rate study, we will be able to lower the replacement cycle from 600+ years.

Water/sewer bills are based on water consumption (water volumetric and sewer volumetric) and nominal fixed fees (water base and sewer base). The most recent rate changes occurred in January 2021. Collected fees support the water and sewer utility operations and capital needs. The rates are designed not to generate any profits, but to cover the true operating and capital improvement costs of the utilities as planned in the water rate study.

The current rate structure (2021) based on the approved rate study is defined below:

Per the adopted rate study, the above charges are billed and collected each month.

Note that some areas of Mount Prospect are served by Illinois American Water, which operates under their own rate structure.

Similarly, the refuse service fees are designed to cover the true cost of service. Although increases had been established, the Village had frozen the refuse rates from 2017 to 2020. The rates were recently increased in January 2021. The current refuse service rates for single-family households are as follows:

Fire Department

Play It Safe This 4th of July

While we encourage you to enjoy barbeques, parties, sunshine, and fun with family and friends this 4th of July, the Mount Prospect Fire Department reminds you that fireworks of all types, including sparklers, are prohibited in Mount Prospect. Only those with proper permits and training are allowed to use fireworks within the Village.

Fireworks present a danger to people and structures. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2019 there were more than 9,000 people treated for fireworks-related injuries. Children and adults can suffer burns, hearing loss, eye damage, and other serious injuries from fireworks. Even sparklers can reach a temperature of up to 1800° and remain hot after they are extinguished.

In data from 2018, the National Fire Protection Association estimated that fireworks started an estimated 19,500 fires causing significant property damage in many cases.



Unauthorized use of fireworks in Mount Prospect can lead to fines ranging from \$500 to \$2,500.

Ways to Get Involved with the Mount Prospect Fire Department

Paid-on-Call Firefighters – POCs



Originally founded as a volunteer organization on September 29, 1913, the Mount Prospect Fire Department became a full-time unit in 1961. The department was, and still is, supplemented

with paid-on-call (POC) volunteer firefighters. The POC program currently consists of 14 members, 12 of which are Mount Prospect residents.

Past and present POC members have come from many different backgrounds and some have used the POC program to become full time firefighters.

POC firefighters must complete basic firefighter certification. They also participate in ride-time with the department to gain practical experience. Once certified, POC members are on-call to provide assistance to the fire department 24/7/365.

POC members provide extra support for structure fires and emergency response. They may also be called out for flooding and power outages caused by major storms. In addition to training in structure fires and emergency response, the POC's are very involved with the community and public education. They participate in events such as the Toys for Kids Drive, Operation North Pole, neighborhood block parties, senior events, and fire safety education at the schools.

Community Emergency Response Team - CERT

Currently, 32 residents of Mount Prospect are part of the Village's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program, collectively donating over 3,000 hours annually to the Village. Established in September 2004, CERT grew out of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Federal Citizen Corps program which provides opportunities for citizens across the country to participate in measures to make their families, their homes, and communities safer from threats and disasters of all kinds.

To be eligible for the CERT program, residents must complete a Citizen Preparedness Training class; classes are offered each October. The team trains a minimum of once a month in addition to specialized training and drills throughout the year. Team members are trained in CPR, first-aid, fire extinguisher use, utility awareness, ground search and rescue (GSAR), incident command, traffic/pedestrian control, radio communications, shelter management, and weather spotting.

When emergency incidents occur, or when large-scale special events are planned in the Village, CERT is called upon to assist with non-critical tasks which free-up police and fire resources to focus on the essential tasks related



to public safety and welfare. The CERT team may assist at a structure fire by finding shelter for the victims or other various rehab efforts. During severe weather, their assistance may be required to provide traffic control for flooding or downed power lines. Enrollment Open for the 2021 Citizens Police Academy

Mount Prospect residents 18 and older who are without any criminal history are encouraged to apply for the 2021 Citizens Police Academy. Classes begin on Monday, September 13, and will continue for eleven consecutive Monday evenings through November 22, from 6:30 pm until 9:30 pm. Classes will be held at the Mount Prospect Police Department.

The Academy allows citizens to get a firsthand look at police operations and to experience police work from the officer's point of view. Topics covered include traffic enforcement, crime scene processing, traffic crash investigation, and criminal law. Academy students will also be allowed to make simulated traffic stops and have an opportunity to use the department's pistol range.

Applications for the Citizens Police Academy are available at the Mount Prospect Police Department front desk and at mountprospect.org/police. Applications are due by 9:00 a.m., August 30. Car Seat Inspections

The Mount Prospect Police Department has certified technicians who can assist you with installing or using a child car seat in your vehicle. Inspections and assistance can be scheduled by calling 847.870.5655 or by using the mpDelivers app.

We always recommend registering your car seat with the manufacturer to receive recalls and safety notices. You can also sign up with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to receive email alerts about car seat and booster seat recalls.

Firearm Safety

Project Childsafe has provided the police department with a supply of firearm safety kits to make available to residents. Each kit includes a free gun lock. You may pick up a

kit while supplies last at the front information desk at police headquarters.



Calling 911

The Village of Mount Prospect is one of twelve northwest suburban communities that form a consolidated intergovernmental emergency dispatch system known as Northwest Central Dispatch System (NWCDS). The service handles police, fire, and EMS



dispatch services across those communities.

If there is any doubt about whether or not to use 911, don't hesitate to make the call. 911 is not just for emergencies and any time you need a police officer dispatched to your location, make the call. Your call to 911 can be made anonymously if you prefer.

NWCDS is also accessible by text. We recommend sending two messages. First, type 911 in the To line, type your location in the message, and hit send. That will allow NWCDS to immediately dispatch an officer to your location. In a second message to 911, tell us what help you need and hit send. An automatic response will come your way, followed by another message from a dispatcher.

Please, do not ever hesitate to call 911 if you need police, fire, or medical assistance.

Document Destruction Event

We ask that you limit your drop-off to no more than 6 boxes or paper shopping bags of documents; business or institutional materials will not be accepted. Paper clips and staples do not need to be removed, but please remove binders. Drop-off will take place from 8 to 11 am. at Public Works, 1700 West Central Road. You may simply drive up and workers will remove the boxes or bags from your car and place them in carts for immediate, on-site destruction. All documents dropped off will be cross-shredded, baled, and recycled. For more information, call

Summer Watering Limits

As part of the Lake Michigan water allocation program, the Village is required to place limits on outdoor water use. These water conservation measures are an important step in protecting our water supply and ensure that there is a continuous adequate water supply for drinking, bathing, and fire protection services.

Village ordinances restrict the use of water from public wells or the Village water distribution system for watering lawns and gardens, filling pools, outdoor washing, or other uses outside of the following days and times:

- Watering your lawn or landscaping is permitted for odd numbered addresses on odd numbered dates and for even numbered addresses on even numbered dates. Watering is only allowed prior to 10 am or after 4 pm on prescribed days. These rules apply 7 days a week.
- Newly sodded areas may be watered at any time on any day for 2 weeks following installation.

Planting of New Trees


As we do each year, the Village is proceeding with a reforestation plan to replace every tree that has been removed from a public parkway, in the order they were removed. You will receive notification if a new tree will be planted in the parkway by your home. While we plan to continue the replacement program into the fall, it may take until next year for some trees to be replaced.

Trees will be chosen by Village staff from among 8 to 10 different species at an Illinois nursery and are guaranteed for one year.

Overhead Sewer Rebate Program

The Village has established the Overhead Sewer Rebate Program to provide financial assistance to residents who want to convert their existing gravity-fed sanitary system into an overhead sanitary sewer



system. To be eligible for this program, the homeowner must be a Village wastewater utility consumer.

Eligible single-family home owners can be reimbursed up to 50% of the cost up to \$7,500.

Water Your Traps

We recommend that you periodically check traps in your floor drains, especially if they have not been used recently. When drains are not used often, they have the potential to dry out which can allow a room to fill with sewer gas from the Village sewer system.

The simple solution is to pour a little freshwater into the drain and top it off with a bit of cooking oil. The oil will create a seal to prevent evaporation of the water.
