Mount Prospect Police Arrest Person for Residential Burglary



Juan C. Armenta-Jimenez

On January 22, 2022, the Mount Prospect Police Department arrested and charged Juan C. Armenta-Jimenez, 38 years old, of 1510 N. Silver Lane, Palatine, Illinois with one count of Residential Burglary and one count of Criminal Damage to Property. These charges stem from an incident that occurred in the 1800 block of Aztec Lane. The Cook County State's Attorney's Office approved charges against Armenta-Jimenez of one (1) felony count of Residential Burglary and one (1) misdemeanor count of Criminal Damage to Property.

On January 22, 2022, at approximately 3:53 AM, the Mount Prospect Police Department responded to the 1800 block of Aztec Lane for a 911 call of an unknown person inside a residence. Officers arrived and met the homeowner, who was with the unknown male, who was later identified as Juan C. Armenta-Jimenez. Through the investigation, officers learned that Armenta-Jimenez entered the home by forcing open a basement window.

Officers arrested Armenta-Jimenez and transported him to the Mount Prospect Police Department Headquarters, where he was subsequently charged. Armenta-



Jimenez was taken to a bond hearing on January 23, 2022, where his bond was set at \$30,000.00 "D". His next scheduled court date is set for February 18, 2022 at 9:00 AM in room 108 of the 3<sup>rd</sup> District Cook County Courthouse in Rolling Meadows.

The public is reminded that criminal charges are not evidence of guilt and that all defendants in a criminal case are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law.
