Central School Open House

All are invited to join the Mount Prospect Historical Society on May 7 for a free Open House at the restored 1896 Central School. Located at 103 South Maple, Central School is one of the few remaining one-room schoolhouses in the state. The Open House will take place from 1:00 to 3:00 pm.



Immediately following the Open House the Historical Society will hold a ceremony to rededicate its Education Center. Situated adjacent to Central School, the Education Center was built in the mid-1990s. At the ceremony, long-time Mount Prospect Historical Society president, and one of the founders of the Education Center, Dolores Haugh will be honored. The Education Center will be formally named in Haugh's honor in acknowledgement of her leadership on the plan to acquire and develop the Historical Society campus and Education Center. Get the Stickers Out!

The Village now offers an unlimited yard waste collection program that does not require the use of the yellow yard waste sticker.

Containerized yard waste, bags and/or rigid containers are no longer required to have the Village imprinted

yellow yard waste sticker affixed for collection. There will be no limit on the number of yard waste bags or yard waste containers placed at the curb for collection.

Residents can submit any unused yard waste stickers to the Finance or Public Works Departments for refunds in person or by mail. All unused stickers returned for reimbursement must be accompanied with a completed reimbursement form available on the Village website. Residents will receive reimbursement in the form of a check approximately two weeks after the village receives the stickers and form. Deadline for submission is December 15, 2017.

Signs of Spring

Before installing any sign, review the Village Sign Code and permit requirements. The Village recently adopted new sign guidelines that can be found in Chapter 7 of the Village Code. A few highlights of the updated sign code include:

- Prohibited signs include any sign placed in the public right of way, signs that move, pennants and streamers, or any sign painted directly on the exterior of a building surface.
- Some signs that are exempt from requiring a permit include:
 - Commercial, temporary signs less than 10 sq. ft. in area on a single-family residential property (garage sale, for sale/lease) or less than 16 sq. ft. on properties other than single-family residential (help wanted, special sales).
 - Non-commercial, temporary signs (i.e. political signs, school events) less than 16 sq. ft. in total area
- Any temporary sign greater than the 16 sq. ft. needs a permit and is limited in size and duration.
- Whenever a new business opens a permit is required for their permanent signs.

Tips for Clearing a Sewer Blockage on your Residential Line

If you experience a sewer blockage notify either Mount Prospect Public Works at 847.870.5640 or Illinois-American at 800.422.2782. Your service provider is designated on your utility statement. Have your contractor diagnose whether the blockage is in your line or the sewer main. If it is in the main, contact the appropriate provider. Once the line is cleared, have your contractor record a video on the line in case further work is needed.

Flood Preparedness and Protection

Local Flood Hazard

Five waterways carry stormwater into, through and away from the Village: the Des Plaines River, McDonald Creek, Feehanville Ditch, Weller Creek and Higgins Creek. Flood hazard areas are associated with each waterway. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has prepared a map that illustrates the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA). The Engineering staff will help locate your property on the map and provide other basic Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) information. This information is especially useful for lenders, insurance agents, house hunters, real estate agents, and interested citizens. The most recent flooding event occurred in April 2013 when almost every neighborhood of the Village experienced flooding.

Flood Preparedness

Floods always occur at the most inconvenient times and with very little warning. But there are many things that you can do to prepare for a flood.

- Prepare a list of emergency phone numbers that can be easily accessed during a flood event. Keep backup records at other location such as at work or at a friend's house
- Keep an inventory of your personal property that can be used to identify what has been damaged and lost during a flood. Photographs or a video record of each room can be helpful.
- Keep photographs of valuable items such as insurance policies, vehicle titles, deeds, bank and credit card account information, wills and important telephone numbers in a location away from your home such as a safe deposit box.
- Talk to your insurance agent about protection against floods and sewer backups.
- Keep on hand cleaning supplies that will be needed to recover from a flood.

Flood Safety

If your basement or building has flooded, remember these precautionary steps:

- Turn off all utilities at the main power switch and close the main gas valve if evacuation appears necessary.
- Be alert for gas leaks. Use a flashlight to inspect for damage rather than candles or lanterns.
- Do not touch any electrical equipment unless it is in a dry area and you are standing on a piece of dry wood while wearing rubber gloves and rubber-sole boots or shoes.
- Be careful after a flood because the floors are often covered with debris and mud which can lead to slipping or stepping on uneven or sharp objects.
- Flood water is often contaminated and can cause severe health threats, so clean everything that got wet.

Flood-proofing

There are many methods that have been successful to protect a building from flood damage. You could consider any of these measures, called retrofitting, to alter your building to eliminate or reduce flood damages including:

- Elevation | This involves raising the house so that the lowest floor is above the flood protection level.
- Relocation | Moving a building out of the flood area is the surest way to protect it from a flood.
- Floodwalls | They work to keep water from reaching your home by constructing barriers out of fill or concrete between the building and the flood water.



- Dry Flood-proofing | Makes the building walls and floor watertight so water does not enter
- Wet Flood-proofing | Modifies the structure and relocates the contents so that when flood water enters the building there is little or no damage.

IMPORTANT NOTE: You must get a permit from the Community Development Department before proceeding with any alteration to your building or land. Even re-grading or filling in the floodplain requires a permit.

Flood Protection

If your property is susceptible to flooding, there are some things you can do to reduce damages.

- Regrading your lot or constructing a small earthen berm may help to keep water away from your building.
- Watertight closures over doorways and windows can prevent flood waters from
 entering through the doorways during a flood event. This method is not
 recommended for houses with basements, or if water will get over two feet deep.
- Furnaces, air conditioners, water heaters and major appliances can be elevated on platforms or moved to higher floors.
- Temporary measures like sandbagging may prevent water from entering your building during a flood event.
- Many houses, even those not in the floodplain, have sewers that back up into the
 basement during heavy rains. A plug or standpipe can stop this if the water doesn't
 get more than one or two feet deep. They can be purchased at a hardware store
 for approximately \$25. For deeper sewer backup flooding, talk to a plumber about
 overhead sewers or backup valves. These measures are called *floodproofing and*retrofitting. More information is available at the Mount Prospect Public Library.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Always check with the Mount Prospect Building Division before you build on, fill, alter or regrade your property or make building alterations. A permit is needed to ensure that all projects comply with our Village Code and does not create drainage problems on any other property.

Drainage System Maintenance

Any debris that is deposited into any part of our drainage system can have a serious impact on flooding, and it is against our Village Code. Dumping materials such as grass clippings, branches, garbage and other unwanted material into any of the Village's waterways, the Des Plaines River, McDonald Creek, Feehanville Ditch, Weller

Creek and Higgins Creek or any drainage ditches can decrease the ability of our drainage system to carry water away from our properties. Contact the Public Works Department if you see any debris that may potentially cause flooding problems.



Flood Insurance

Most homeowner's insurance policies do not cover losses due to flooding. However, since the Village of Mount Prospect is a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), flood insurance is available to all property owners or renters in the Village. Coverage can be obtained on the building as well as on the contents. Contact your insurance agent to find out more about flood insurance. And because of the Village's participation in the CRS Program, property owners are eligible for up to a 15% discount on the flood insurance premiums. Please take note that there is a 30-day waiting period after the purchase of flood insurance before it goes into effect.

Some insurance companies offer sewer backup and sump pump failure insurance that can be added on to your homeowner's insurance policy. Contact your agent for more information.

Floodplain Development Permit

The Village of Mount Prospect has adopted Floodplain Regulations (Chapter 22 of the Village Code). The regulations help to minimize the potential losses due to periodic flooding. You must get a Floodplain Development Permit for all construction activity within a floodplain.

More Information

If you have flooding or drainage concerns or would like any additional information, just stop by or call the Public Works Department at 847.870.5640 (TDD: 847.392.1235) and ask for the Engineering Division. Engineering Staff will freely assist you, including visiting your site, to identify possible ways to reduce the risk of flooding your property.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has a website that can also provide additional information, fema.gov.

Call Before You Dig

If you are planning to dig for an outdoor project on your property, Illinois law requires that you contact JULIE (Joint Utility Locating Information for Excavators) to locate any underground utilities. **Call 811 or 800.892.0123 for underground utility locates at least 48 hours before the start of any excavation**, not including Saturdays, Sundays or holidays. Recycling Programs

The Village offers a number of recycling programs sponsored by the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) including:

- Household batteries
- Pharmaceuticals including prescription and over the counter medications
- Medical sharps
- · Compact fluorescent and fluorescent tubes

To participate in any of these programs, bring acceptable recycling items to Public Works, 1700 East Central Road between 7:30 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. For a complete list of acceptable items, visit mountprospect.org.

Only Rain Down the Drain

Storm drains and roadside ditches lead to our inland lakes, streams, rivers and Lake Michigan. Any motor oil, pet waste, leaves, grass clippings or dirty water from washing your car that enters a storm drain gets into our water without being treated. Never dump motor oil,



chemicals, pet waste, dirty or soapy water, or anything else down the storm drain or into a ditch. Pollutants that get into storm drains can poison fish, birds, and other wildlife, and can find their way into drinking water supplies. In addition, dirt, litter, branches and grass clippings can clog storm drains and cause flooding. Be sure to report anyone dumping materials into a storm drain or ditch to village officials.

Ten Things You Can Do to Prevent Water Pollution

- 1. Sweep up driveways and sidewalks instead of hosing them with water.
- 2. Never dump anything down a storm drain or into a ditch.
- 3. Plant bare spots in your yard.
- 4. Compost your yard waste.
- 5. Use fertilizers sparingly and avoid pesticides.
- 6. Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces.
- 7. Take your car to a car wash instead of washing it in the driveway.
- 8. Check cars for leaks and recycle motor oil.
- 9. Pick up after your pet.
- 10. If you are on a septic system, have it inspected and pumped regularly.

Just four quarts of oil can form an eight-acre oil slick if spilled or dumped down a storm drain.

LAWN SPRINKLER PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS | To protect the

public drinking water supply, the State of Illinois requires that all lawn irrigation sprinklers have cross-connection and backflow protection. There are no exceptions and there is no grand-fathering for older systems. As required by the State of Illinois, all backflow devices are to be certified by a State Licensed Cross Connection Control Device Inspector (CCCDI). If the system has been removed, please have your plumber/

inspector notify Public Works. A copy of the annual certification is to be sent to the Public Works Department as part of the monitoring requirements. For more information, please contact Public Works at 847.870.5640 or visit the village's website.



Fire Department

Severe Weather Awareness

Awareness is the key to being prepared for severe weather. In springtime, common severe weather situations include thunderstorms and tornadoes. Familiarizing yourself with the different types of watches and warnings will help keep you and your family safe during severe weather.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH | Conditions are conducive to the development of severe thunderstorms.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING | A severe thunderstorm has actually been observed by spotters or indicated on radar, and is occurring or is imminent.

TORNADO WATCH | Conditions are conducive to the development of tornadoes.

TORNADO WARNING | A tornado has actually been sighted by spotters or indicated on radar, and is occurring or is imminent.

If a tornado warning is issued by the National Weather Service for our area, and there is reasonable belief that Mount Prospect or a surrounding community will be affected, you will hear the Village warning sirens activate. While sirens will not activate for severe thunderstorm watches or warnings or tornado watches, those conditions still warrant your attention. If the warning sirens are activated you should immediately take the following actions to protect yourself and your family.

If indoors at the time of activation:

- Seek shelter immediately in the lowest level of your house, preferably in an interior room away from doors and windows
- Tune to radio or television stations for the latest information
- Remain in your place of shelter until the threat has passed

If outdoors at the time of activation:

- Seek shelter indoors, but not in a car or mobile home
- If there are no safe options indoors and a tornado is imminent, lie flat in the nearest ditch or depression and use your hands to cover your head

If We Can't Find You, We Can't Help You

When a fire breaks out in your home or someone is having a medical emergency, every second could mean the difference between life and death. That's why it's so important that the Fire Department be able to find your home immediately. The Fire Department reminds residents that if we can't find you, we can't help you — and the best way residents can ensure that the Fire Department can find their home, is to be sure that your house number is easily visible from the street.

According to the Village code, street numbers must be at least two and a half inches high and must be visible from the roadway. The following tips will also help ensure the Fire Department can find a home:

- Use numbers instead of words (123 instead of one hundred twenty-three)
- Use numbers that contrast in color to the brick/siding
- Place the numbers in an area that is illuminated at night
- Residents that live in a condominium or apartment should make sure both their name and unit number appear on the building's directory or their call button

Home Again Program

If you are concerned about a loved one with a cognitive impairment, we encourage you to register for our Home Again Program. This community-wide effort assists the police in identifying and returning home those persons, who become injured, lost and/or separated from their family/caregiver due to a disoriented state. Registration is available at the front desk of the police department.

Vacant Home Watch

If you are traveling away from your home for more than a day or two, contact the front desk of the police department at 847.870.5656 to request a vacant home watch. Homes on the watch list, will be monitored by police officers during their routine patrols of the neighborhood.

Bicycle Registration



Register your bicycle with the police department, so in the event of it being stolen and recovered, the department will be able to return the bicycle back to you. You can register your bicycle online under the Crime Prevention tab of the Police Department section of the Village website mountprospect.org

Should I Call 9-1-1?

Many questions arise about when it is appropriate to call 9-1-1. Dialing 9-1-1 is the best way to get a police officer to respond to your location. Whether you need to report a crime or a dog in the neighborhood is barking at 2:00 a.m. a call to 9-1-1 is the way to go. The police department encourages all residents to call 9-1-1 if any suspicious activity is seen in their neighborhood. Please use the non-emergency number of 847.870.5656 for informational inquiries or to request overnight parking permission.

Keep Your Dogs on a Leash

As the summer is upon us, more and more dog owners are out enjoying the beautiful weather with their four legged friends. The Police Department reminds dog owners that Village Code requires that owners or the person in control of a dog is securely fastened to a leash or tether while

on private or public property. In addition, they must properly clean up after the animal. A violation of either of these two sections of the Village Code may result in the owner or the person in control of the dog receiving a ticket and a fine. Let's all keep our dogs on their leashes and pick up after them to allow everyone to the beautiful outdoors.
